New Americans


New Americans refers to all people who were born outside the U.S. who moved to the U.S. to live here, regardless of their immigration status.

- New Americans can be people who have recently moved to the U.S. or people who have lived in the U.S. for decades.
- Some new Americans are people with disabilities and developmental disabilities.
- The terms "New Americans" and "immigrants" can both be used.





 ONA assists all new Americans with accessing and navigating a variety of free services and supports through its statewide network of communitybased providers.



 - Referrals to free immigrant services.




Golden Door Program

New Americans with Disabilities



It can be difficult for new Americans to access the disability services they need.

It can be hard to find disability services and resources in languages other than English.

New Americans face additional challenges, for instance, getting assessments and evaluations in languages other than English to meet eligibility requirements to receive disability services.

- Host workshops.
- Create and share multilingual resources.
- Builds partnerships and provides technical assistance.
- Launched the ONA Bilingual Coordinator Program, in Brooklyn, NY.
- Share strategies to increase access to disability services for new Americans.



The Initiative aims to help new Americans of all ages with all types of disabilities.

5 Years of Partnerships

The ONA Ramirez June Initiative launched as a grant in 2019 from the Council on Developmental Disabilities and the NYS Office for People With Developmental Disabilities signed on as a strategic partner.



What's in Voyage?



- Multilingual information on child development (2 months – 5 years) and the early identification of disabilities.
- Each copy is bilingual with all content in English and a second language.
- Provides ages for developmental screenings (starting at 9 months), autism screenings (starting at 18 months), Well-Child Visits, developmental milestones, activities to promote child development, and disability resources in NYS.
